Language

The official language of Serbia is Serbian, a South Slavic language. Serbian language is almost identical to languages spoken in Croatia, Bosnia and Montenegro, and is very similar to Macedonian and Bulgarian.

Serbian alphabet has 30 letters and it's phonetic: one letter per sound. That makes it easy to learn to read and write. Serbian grammar is entirely different matter –Serbian language has seven word cases.

Another rare feature of Serbian language is the presence of two alphabets: Cyrillic (shown in light blue) and Latin (shown in navy). The two alphabets are almost equivalent; the only difference is in the glyphs used. While Cyrillic alphabet is in official use, in everyday life you will see both alphabets being used all the time, in newspapers, street signs, etc.
